9th Grade

Why do grades matter?

Starting with 9th grade, your student will begin building an official transcript, the four-year record of classes and grades.

A transcript shows:

- Cumulative GPA (Grade Point Average)
- Credits earned and attempted
- State requirements

Maintaining a strong GPA for college and career-ready courses is the best way to prepare for the future. This is why it's important to connect to resources now!

Encourage your student to:

- Meet with their advisor, to make sure they take all the courses required for graduation
- Stay focused and organized in classes.
- Ask questions!
- Use a planner, calendar, or phone to plan ahead and keep track of assignments, homework, and extracurricular activities!

Stay Connected!

 Encourage your student to connect with a mentor—this could be a community member, ACS staff member, teacher or counselor!



- Build relationships with teachers, coaches, and employers over the next four years of high school. They can serve as a guide, be a resource, and write strong recommendation letters for college, scholarships, apprenticeships, and job applications!

What's PSEO?

Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) is a program that allows 11th and 12th-grade students to earn **both high school and college credit** while still in high school.

- Most PSEO courses are offered on the campus of the postsecondary institution; some courses are offered online.
- Each participating college or university sets its own admissions requirements for enrollment into the PSEO courses.
- As you plan your 11th grade schedule,
 11th grade students may take PSEO courses on a full- or part-time basis.
- For more information, talk to your counselor!
- Students must inform their advisor by May 30 of each year of their intent to enroll in postsecondary courses during the following school year.

Know your Options!
